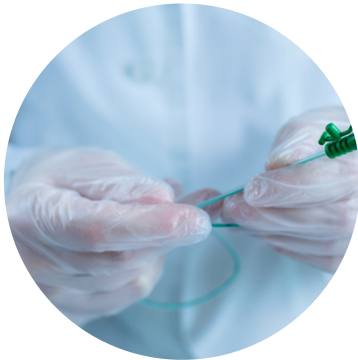

Background



25% of hospitalised patients need catheters



Catheterization causes up to 50% of all urinary tract infections (CAUTIs)



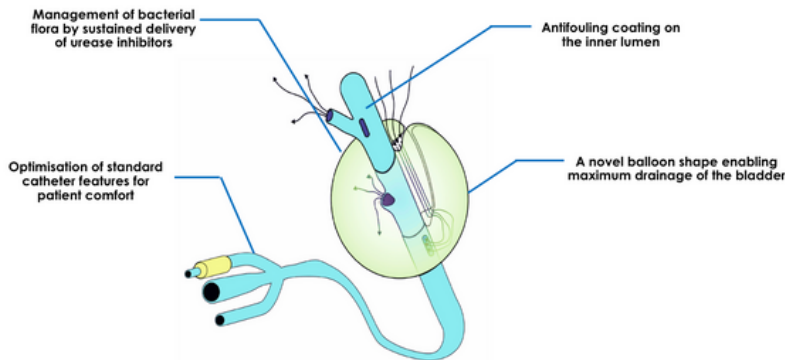
CAUTIS > Antibiotic Resistance



CAUTIs can lead to more serious complications resulting in 2,100 deaths in the UK annually

Solution

Each CAUTI episode is costing the NHS £1700 per patient, resulting in a sum total of £2 billion pounds spent on this very problem every year.



Our solution is to better optimize the standard features of a catheter for patient comfort

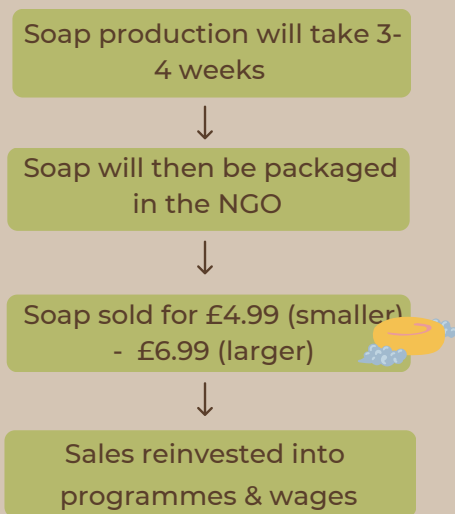
At Equo, not only are we trying to help homeless women, but we are also trying to repurpose food that would normally end up in landfills.

42% of employers across the UK have admitted a high likelihood of terminating an employee's contract if they were homeless

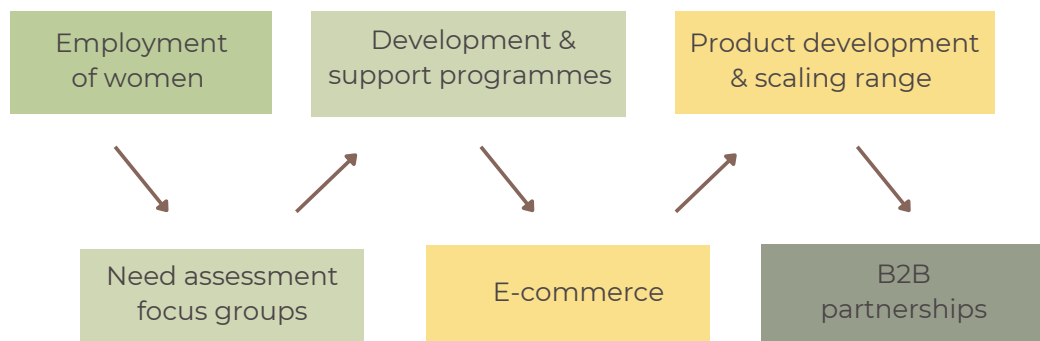
